Dear Sir or Madam:

I am writing in regard to the procedures for graduates of your school to become members of the New Hampshire bar. Previously, graduates of the Massachusetts School of Law who are members in good standing of the bar of one of the States of the United States were permitted to take the New Hampshire bar exam, but they were not eligible for admission to the New Hampshire bar by motion pursuant to New Hampshire Supreme Court Rule 42. The New Hampshire Supreme Court has authorized me to inform you that graduates of the Massachusetts School of Law will henceforth be eligible to apply for admission to the New Hampshire bar by motion, as long as the graduate satisfies all of the requirements for admission on motion set forth in Rule 42 other than the requirement of having graduated from an ABA-approved law school.
