

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
MASSACHUSETTS SCHOOL OF LAW/FISHER COLLEGE

AGREEMENT:

Made this 24th day of September 2015, between Fisher College of Boston (“Fisher”), Massachusetts, and Massachusetts School of Law of Andover (“MSLAW”), Massachusetts.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this agreement is to provide the mechanism by which students from Fisher and MSLAW may attend classes at either institution and use credits from those classes towards and Masters of Business Administration (MBA), Juris Doctor (JD) or a combined MBA/JD Degree. This agreement by Fisher and MSLAW recognizes the common objectives, content, and student competencies exist in programs in specific disciplines common to both institutions. Based on the identification of common course content and competencies, and appropriate arrangement can be made for students to pursue course work at Fisher and MSLAW and to be awarded a Master’s in Business Administration degree from Fisher and/or a Juris Doctor degree from MSLAW upon completion of his or her studies at these institutions.

CONDITIONS FOR ARTICULATION:

The following conditions of articulation are hereby set forth:

1. The students eligible for participation in this joint program must meet all admissions requirements and be enrolled at either Fisher or MSLAW, as matriculated students in good standing.

All eligible students may enroll and take classes that are offered by either the MBA program at Fisher or MSLAW. Students may transfer six credit hours of course work taken at either institution for course credit towards the MBA or JD degrees. Students accepted in either institution are automatically accepted into other after providing all appropriate documentation.

The courses offered in the MBA program, which are eligible for up to 12 credits of transfer credit and can be used to satisfy elective requirements are:

2. Students must achieve a satisfactory grade for these courses. In no event will a grade lower than a C from MSLAW and a B from Fisher be considered a satisfactory grade to be eligible for transfer credit.


A cumulative G.P.A. of 3.0 or higher is needed for graduation at Fisher and 2.0 at MSLAW. If the student falls below the required G.P.A., the student is put on probation.

3. The student who decides to pursue a joint degree or a second degree after having completed the MBA or JD degree must apply using normal application procedures, meet all applicable deadlines and pay all application fees. MSLAW does not require students to take the LSAT as part of the application process. Fisher will not require eligible students to take GMAT as part of application process.
 - At the request of a student, a Dean, academic advisor or designated individual at the respective institution will evaluate the student's qualifications and certify that the conditions in paragraphs 1 and 3 above have been met. The institution's designee will then forward a recommendation for admission to the other institution based on the stated conditions in the Articulation Agreement. In making this recommendation, the institution's designee will consider the student's moral character and the academic promise among other factors in arriving at a recommendation.
 - Upon receipt of the student's application, the certification, favorable recommendation, and finding that the conditions in paragraphs 1, 3, 4, and 5 above have been met, the graduate program will admit the student as a regularly matriculated student eligible to pursue his or her graduate degree, unless there are compelling reasons why that recommendation should not be followed.
4. This agreement shall commence upon the date of execution of this agreement and shall continue until such time as the agreement is terminated by either of the parties.
5. This agreement may be terminated in whole or in part by either party giving a full year's notice in writing to the other party. However, such termination shall not take effect with regard to students already enrolled,


until such time as those students have completed their respective course of study in either institution.

6. Each school will charge students its normal tuition and fees and will keep the entirety of these funds.
7. Each school will have the ability to conduct classes at the other schools campus as well as conduct student recruitment activities.
8. Students wishing to receive either the MBA from Fisher or the JD from MSLAW under this agreement must meet the normal application deadlines and pay the normal graduation fees. Students in this program will be eligible for graduation after completing their course of study and satisfying all graduation requirements.
