PaperCut's Mobility Print - How to print from a Chromebook





2. Install the [Mobility Print Chrome extension](#).

3. Open the page to print.

- The way you print is different depending on the app you're printing from. For more information, see the documentation for the app. When you select a printer, make sure you select a Mobility Print printer as identified by the PaperCut icon.

4. Print the content.

- For example, to print from Microsoft Word, press **Ctrl+P**, select a printer; then click **Print**.

5. When prompted, sign in.

Tip

- Need to assign an account to your print job? You can do that at the printer or via the Mobile web client.
- Your Chromebook must run ChromeOS version 114+.

We do have an open feature request to add more advance print settings for Chromebooks. If you would like to raise a support ticket with us @ support.papercut.com and mention MOB-685 then we can attach your ticket to the request and keep you updated on it's progress.

In the meantime, we have found that some customers have implemented a work around by creating separate print queues for specific features (hole-punching, stapling etc) and then publishing multiple queues for users defined by the naming convention. Whilst not a perfect solution it may help achieve what you are looking for.
